Dear Families of Holy Cross,

This is my last newsletter of the year! As you are aware I will be returning to Nine Acres Primary leaving Holy Cross in the safe hands of the Senior Leadership Team of Ms Freeley, Mrs Banks and Mrs Margetts.

It is important to take this moment to reflect and recognise our successes but also to keep in mind our continued journey to make Holy Cross the best school for our pupils and families.

I am delighted to share just some of our academic outcomes this year:

TEST	HOLY CROSS RESULTS	NATIONAL OUTCOMES
Y6 READING	84%	74%
Y6 WRITING	76%	69%
Y6 MATHEMATICS	81%	71%
Y6 COMBINED (Read/Write/Maths)	67%	59%

The KS1 (Y2) results are similarly inline or above national outcomes. Year 1 Phonics Check results are above national with 87% and EYFS Outcomes are above national with 82%.

Plans are already in place to further support Reading, Writing and the wider curriculum as a priority focus and with the strong leadership of Ms Freeley and Mrs Banks, I am sure that Holy Cross will go from strength to strength.

It hasn't just been about learning outcomes. What I have seen in my time at Holy Cross is a renewed sense of joy across the school. From trips out, sports opportunities, musical achievements, weekly celebrations in assembly, visitors, reinstating the whole school Mass, summer fair and our very own Jubilee party. Holy Cross has been a place of change but decisions made have held the children at the heart. I know there are lots more opportunities being planned to further bring our community together.

Of course with any journey we have some 'Welcomes' and 'Goodbyes'. We will be saying 'Goodbye and Good Luck' to Miss Mather as she leaves us to take a leadership position at another Island Primary school. Miss Mather has been with Holy Cross for 12 years and seen many of our children grow into the wonderful people they are today.

We welcome Miss Chloe Whitehurst and Miss Charlotte Austin to Team Holy Cross in Y6 and Y2 and as you know Mrs Findlay continues with us teaching the children in Y5. Mr McCormack, who has been instrumental in improving sports across the school, also remains with us continuing to inspire our children and provide opportunity for sports.

I would like to take this opportunity to THANK the staffing Team of Holy Cross. Their passion to continue to see the school develop and their determination for success has been a credit to them all.
