Dear Parents,

Congratulations on completing the first full week back at school following the summer break. I have continued to be very impressed with how pupils have come back to school. Our new Reception class have been exceptional and they seem to be picking up the classroom routines very quickly, well done!

A huge well done also to the Holy Cross staff who have been getting to grips with the school's new routines and changes. In my learning walks this week I have observed pupils being very engaged in their lessons and learning.

We have had two school trips already this term: Year 2 visited Bembridge Windmill to support their English/Geography/History/ Art and DT topics this half term. Pupils showed great CARES values in overcoming the surprisingly steep ladders and staircases in the windmill. Year 1 visited Calbourne Mill to support their English/History/Science and DT topics this half term. Year 1 met the Miller and learnt how flour is made. The pupils were very persuasive and have come away with some free bags of flour that they are going turn into bread next week (photos below).

Year 3 have started a block of swimming lessons as part of the PE curriculum this week and we had our first Year 5 & Year 6 football matches against other schools.

Next week we are having a bespoke orienteering system installed across the school grounds. The system is designed to support a range of curriculum subjects and support physical activities. We are all looking forward to using it in our lessons.

On Tuesday Father Jonathan is celebrating our first school mass of the year in celebration of the Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross. The feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross commemorates the discovery of the True Cross by Saint Helena, the mother of Emperor Constantine in 326 AD. The cross was discovered near the site of Christ's crucifixion. It was divided into three parts, with one part remaining in Jerusalem, one part sent to Rome, and a third part sent to Constantinople.



The prayer below was written by St. Thomas Aquinas.

Through Jesus' sacrificial death on Mount Calvary, the cross became the source of eternal salvation and the ultimate sign of God's love for humanity.

Christians ever since have looked to the cross, to Jesus' Passion and death on that first Good Friday, for consolation and hope in times of darkness. It is a constant reminder of God's love for each one of us and a pledge of future glory.

St. Thomas Aquinas, the brilliant but humble theologian of the 14th century, always looked to the cross throughout his life and composed a short and simple prayer to remind him of it.

The Cross is my sure salvation. The Cross I ever adore. The Cross of my Lord is with me. The Cross is my refuge.
